

This year marks the 40th anniversary of Anne Summers' classic feminist manifesto Damned Whores and God's Police. Anne will discuss the contemporary relevance of this significant Australian work and argue that our current preoccupation with measuring progress is at the expense of exploring whether Australian women have fundamentally changed. Anne Summers argues that we have updated and modernised the stereotypes but we have not yet expunged them.




OPEN MIND LECTURE


National Non-Fiction Festival, Geelong




